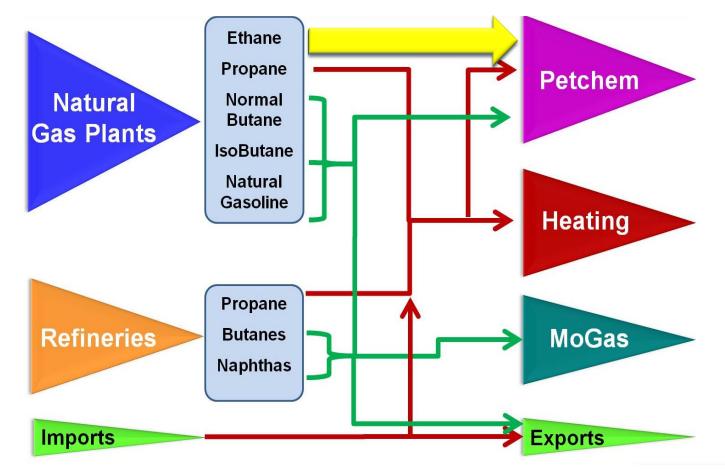

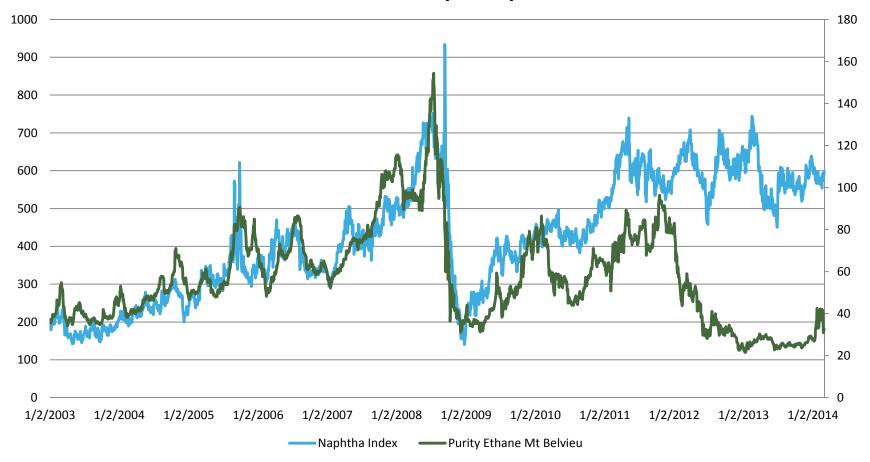
The polyolefins chain







Ethane vs. Naphtha price





- The North American petrochemical industry is bullish about the future thanks to the shale gas boom
- Olefins, in particular, are undergoing a renaissance and dreaming big – less than 7 years after being left for dead

Ethylene – More than 11 million mt/year in announced greenfield expansions

Up to 2.45 million mt/year (brownfield)
Propylene – Up to 4.1 million mt/year (greenfield)
Butadiene – TPC Group to expand on-purpose production

- Derivative plants are also in the works, mostly for polyethylene resin, which could see capacity expanded by 7 million mt/year
- Methanol production in North America is staging an impressive comeback after years of exile



North American propylene at a glance

Shift to light feeds at the cracker has diminished production, thus injecting volatility into polypropylene pricing



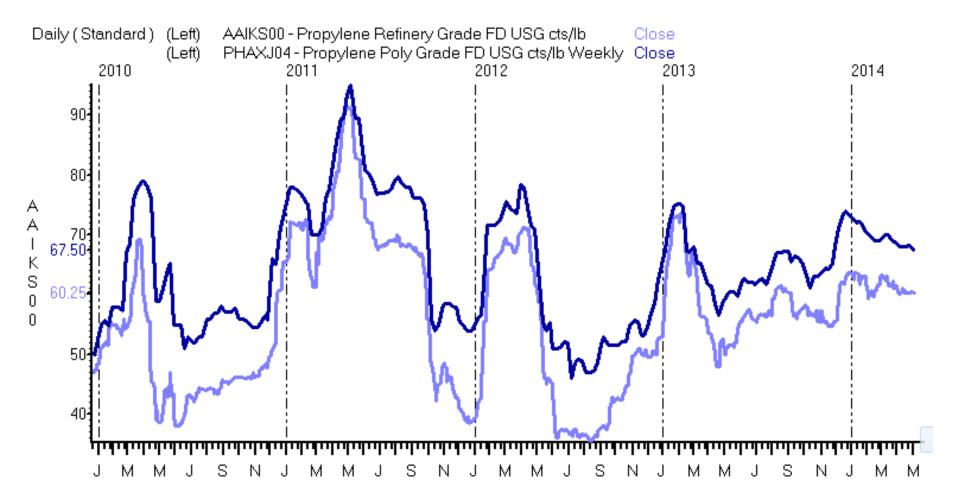
The propylene dilemma



- Shift to lighter feedstocks in US has significantly reduced high-purity propylene production from the steam cracking process
- Weak gasoline demand during economic downturn and poor refining economics have also hurt propylene output.
- Lower operating rates in refineries/closures in recent years has meant less refinery-grade propylene available.
- Tightness in RGP affects availability of higher-purity propylene
- Market has become more volatile over the past 3-4 years, but relief could be on the way

Tightening supply yields volatility

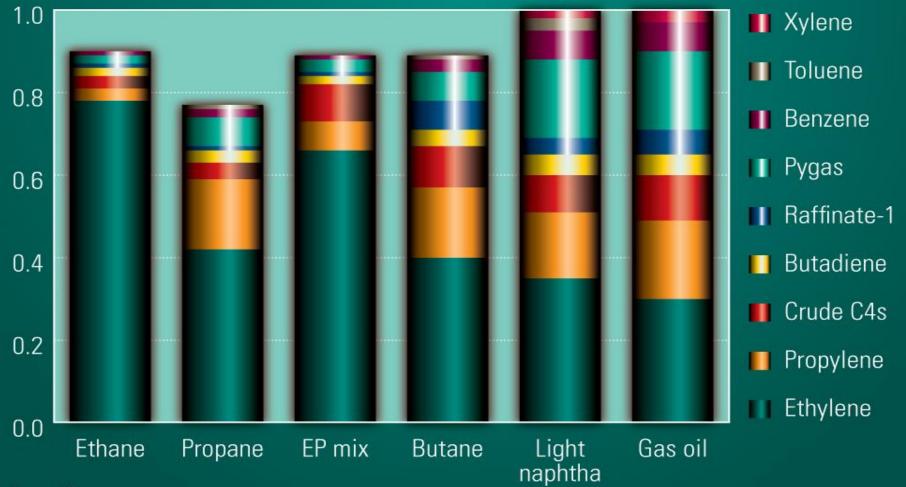




Co-products squeezed

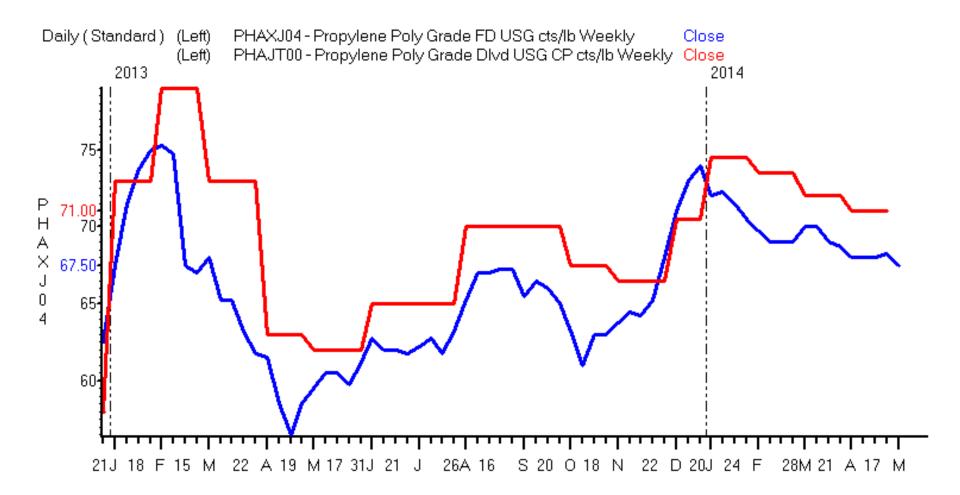

Higher feedstock prices and limited production against steady demand hinders exports beyond Mexico; Asia pricing influences Latin America



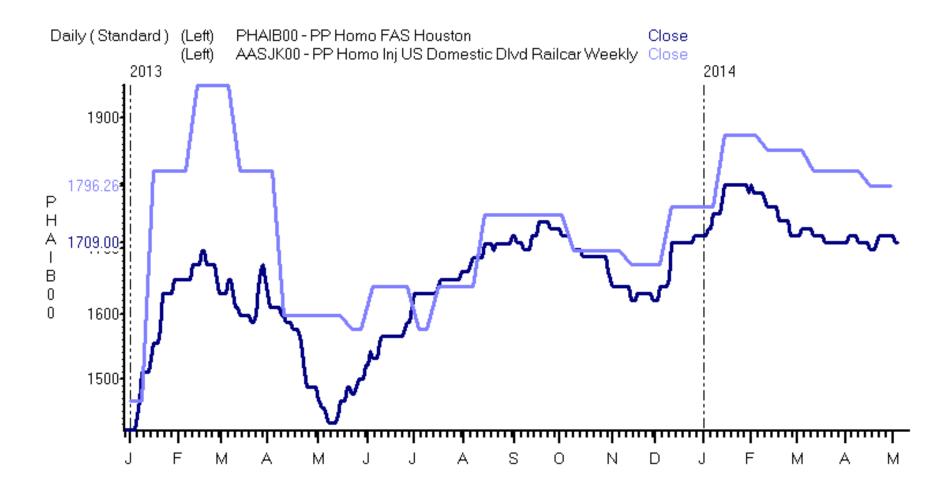

- Only one expansion announced (though another is coming)
- For the past few years, the business has looked unattractive, with the likes of Dow and Sunoco exiting it all together
- In 2012, Chevron Phillips and Sumika ended a JV in Pasadena, Texas, taking 320,000 mt/year out of the market
- "Polypropylene is going the way of polystyrene" PP seller

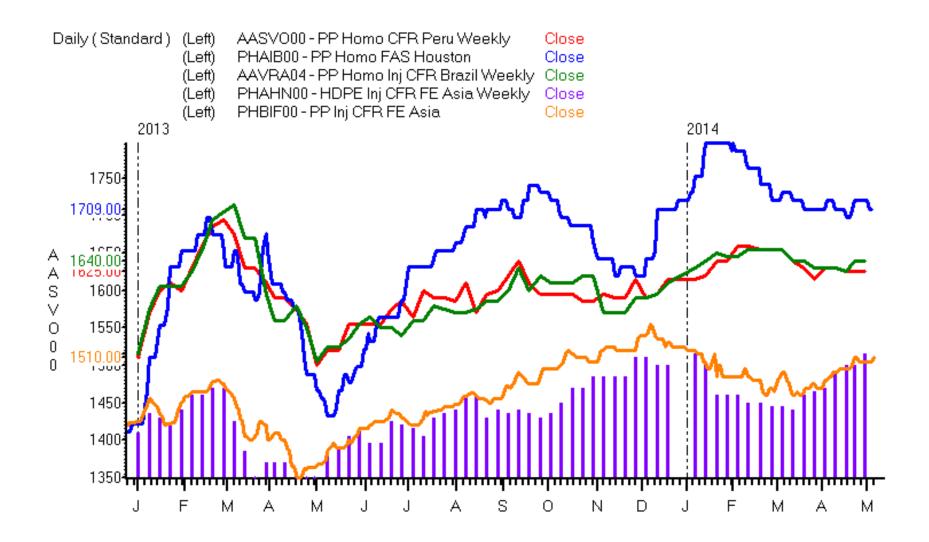
US PP contracts follow PGP



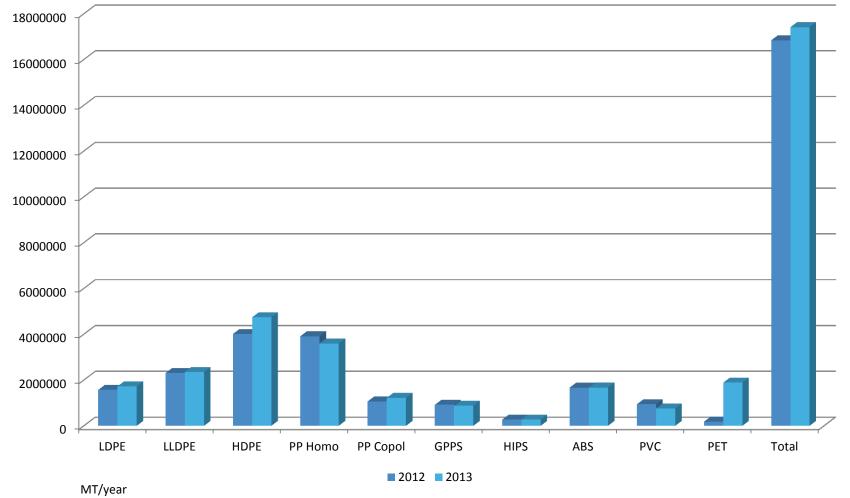


US PP uncompetitive globally





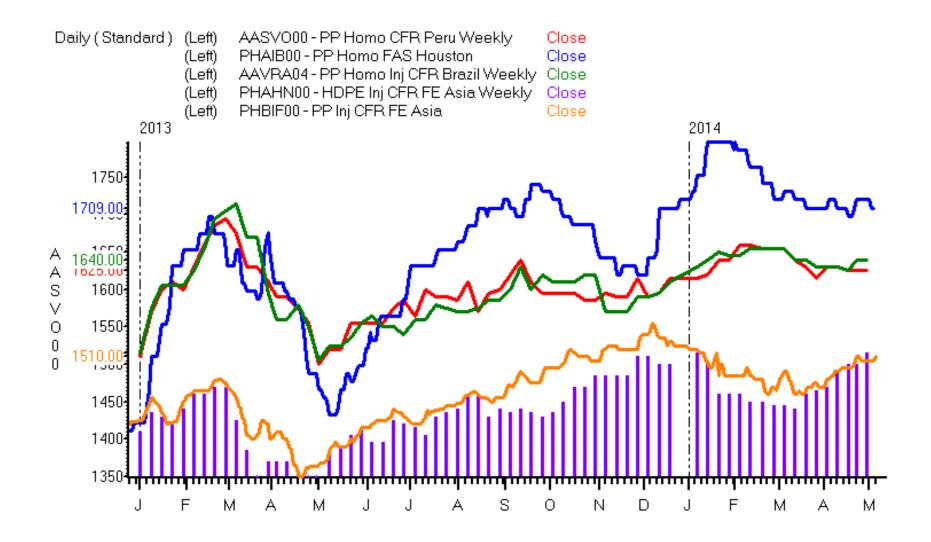
