# 1:30 pm Stewardship of the Facility Portfolio: Taking the Long View

Most facility managers need to act as stewards of their buildings, planning to sustain the existing portfolio
for the long term. The challenges faced by good stewards include dealing with older buildings that need to
be modernized with new and ever-changing technology; making the case for deferred maintenance funding
when it's easier to get funding for new construction; assessing the risk to programs and the organizational
mission presented by aging facilities and systems; and rationalizing the portfolio to determine which assets are
"bulldozer bait" and which are worth the investment.
